#### Fund Raising with TD Bank

Union Council 4504 has joined TD Bank's Affinity program. The Affinity program is a great opportunity for all of us at Union Council to raise money for our charitable fund simply by linking accounts at TD Bank to Union Council. TD Bank will contribute \$10 to our council for every existing checking account which is linked to 4504 and \$50 for each new account linked to 4504. There is no cost to any of us for linking our accounts and your banking information is completely private.

Our council will have no access to anyone's banking information nor will we even have a list of what accounts are linked. TD Bank will simply send us a report at the end of each year telling us how many accounts are linked and accompany that report with a check from TD Bank for the calculated amount. The check will be deposited in to Union Council 4504's charitable fund, enabling us to help more of our brothers and neighbors in need.

This program is applicable to personal and business accounts and is not limited to just brother knights. It is applicable to anyone willing to link their accounts to Knights of Columbus 4504. All you need to do is visit any TD Bank branch and ask any officer to link your account to Knights of Columbus 4504 or code number AF442.



Items in BOLD are the most requested items. (Please package all liquids, including shampoo, mouthwash, etc., in zip-lock bags.)



- SNACK FOOD: dry cereal, beef jerky/Slim Jims, pretzels/chips, cookies, gum and hard candy, granola and power bars, protein bars, small packs of Fig Newtons, Oreos, Cheez-its, trail mix or dried fruit, salted sunflower seeds/pumpkin seeds, powdered drink mix (Gatorade, kool-aid, Crystal Light), condiments and spices, tuna in pouches, Rice Krispie treats, nuts, hot sauce, pudding cups, peanut butter/jelly, coffee, tea, instant cappuccino and hot chocolate
- Travel Size Toiletries: Advil, Tylenol, cold/cough drops, sinus meds, antacids, baby wipes, liquid hand sanitizer/cleaner, breath mints, Listerine strips, razors, floss, shampoo, hair gel, chapstick, soap and deodorant, Q-tips, eye drops, mouthwash, tissues, hand and body lotion, foot powder, toothpaste and toothbrushes, nail clippers/files, feminine hygiene products, shoe insole cushions, vitamins
